2023 - 2024 School Uniform Policy

Day school students: Day school students are required to wear their uniforms every day of school, including field trips.

Preschool students: Preschool students are strongly encouraged to wear their uniforms every day of school.

Boys:

- Light or dark blue polo shirt (long sleeve or short).
- Navy blue pants (or shorts weather permitting). No Jeans.
- Zipped Navy blue sweater for warmth, as needed.
- Black or navy shoes, socks, & belts.

Girls:

Option 1

- Light or dark blue polo shirt (long sleeve or short).
- Navy blue skirt (navy shorts underneath for modesty) or skort.
- Navy blue leggings or tights underneath skirts (for warmth).
- Navy blue sweaters, either zipped or pull over for warmth, as needed.
- Black or navy shoes, socks, & belts.

Option 2

- Light or dark blue uniform short sleeve skater dress.
- Dark blue cartwheel shorts or dark blue leggings.
- Zipped Navy blue sweater for warmth, as needed.
- Black or navy shoes, socks, & belts.

School Uniform Exchange: Last school year, Tricia Zahner started a school uniform exchange. There are some bins in the school office where anyone can take (or donate) school uniforms. Feel free to use anything there! The school office is open during the week from 7:30 am -12:30 pm.

Benefits of wearing school uniforms:

- Simplifies the morning routine for school families. Parents and children know how students will be dressing for school.
- Elevates the importance of learning. The type of clothing you wear will affect your attitude towards what you are doing.
